

0100 PREAMBLE

Indian Social Science Academy (ISSA) organizes **Indian Social Science Congress (ISSC)** every year with a view to discovering, developing and disseminating science of Nature-Human-Society through critical appraisal and integration of current research and theory in all subjects of science taught and researched in Indian Universities, Colleges, IITs, IIITs, NITs, Regional Engineering Colleges, Medical Colleges, AIIMS, PGIs, NISERS, ISERS, CSIR, ICAR, ICPR, ICMR, ICSSR and ICHR Institutes/Laboratories for making India and its people creative, self-reliant, prosperous, healthy and happy while living in peace and harmony with Nature.

0200 HISTORY

Indian Social Science Academy was established on August 15, 1974 with its headquarters at Allahabad with a view to creating a new science of Nature-Human-Society in India capable of creating new Self-Reliant (**Atmanirbhar**) democratic Republic of India free from hunger, disease, ignorance, discrimination, oppression of man by man. Two years later, it began organizing National Science Congress. Named as **Indian Social Science Congress**. First Indian Social Science Congress (then it was called **All India Social Science Convention**) was held from February 15 to 17, 1976 at Allahabad. Since then it has been held at different universities, details of which are given on page 67. The 40th session of the Indian Social Science Congress was held from December 19-23, 2016 at University of Mysore, Mysuru and the 41st session of it was held from December 18 to 22, 2017 at Periyar University, Salem. The 42nd Indian Social Science Congress was held from December 27 to 31, 2018 at Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology, Bhubaneswar, the 43rd Indian Social Science Congress was held from January 17-21, 2020 at Bengaluru Central University, Bengaluru and the 44th Indian Social Science Congress was held from March 15-19, 2021 at Samrat Ashok Technological Institute, Vidisha (M.P.). Each ISSC had a focal theme, details of which are given on page 67.

All subjects/disciplines of science of Nature-Humans-Society are represented in Indian Social Science Congress. There are 28 Subject Research Committees and 21 Interdisciplinary Thematic Panels in it.

Word Science in Indian Social Science Congress is prefixed with social as science as knowledge is the result of collective mental and physical labour. Science is without any boundary and, is indivisible. Indian Social Science Congress, therefore, is indeed, science congress in true sense. Its focus is on 'Science of Nature-Human-Society'.

University Grants Commission recognizes Indian Social Science Congress on par with Indian Science Congress with distinction of having greater potentiality for developing new indigenous science and technology needed for self-reliant national development. Every session of Indian Social Science Congress has a focal theme. (P 67). Creative potentialities of people of India can flower only when Science Education and Research is carried in All Indian languages. The Indian Social Science Academy, therefore seeks to promote science education and research in all Indian Languages for flowering of the creative potentialities of all people of India which alone can enable them to liberate themselves and stand on their own feet. All those who are engaged in pursuit of science and all those who wish to pursue science are cordially invited to join the Indian Social Science Academy in order to build new science of Nature-Human-Society capable of making India and its people **Atmanirbhar, Happy and Creative**.

0400 FOCAL THEME

‘Environment, Energy and Health’ is the focal theme of the XLV Indian Social Science Congress. A note on it is given on page 20-23.

0500 OBJECTIVES

The Indian Social Science Congress is a multi-disciplinary national science forum, which promotes integration of Science of Nature-Human-Society through intra, inter and multi-disciplinary appraisal and integration of current research and theory. Its deliberations, therefore, relate to (a) the focal theme, (b) current research and theory in each subject/discipline of Science, (c) inter and multi-disciplinary deliberations on the major India's and world's problems; (d) emerging areas of research and (e) improving the quality of education and research through capacity building programmes for young scientists. Specific objectives related to the focal theme, **‘Environment, Energy and Health’** are as follows:

- 0501 Are the environment and energy in India and elsewhere clean, unpolluted and congenial to existence of all forms of life including humans on Planet Earth? If not, why?
- 0502 Is the symbiotic relationship between environment, energy and ecology congenial and sustainable? If not, why? Is Energy clean? If yes, why do people talk about ‘clean energy’ or ‘Green Energy?’.
- 0303 What is the state of bio-diversity and natural resources in India and other countries. How has accelerated process of deforestation, desertification and mining affected biodiversity, environment and ecology?
- 0504 What is the quantum of pollution of water, air, food, in terms of continuous consumption and unsustainable growth?
- 0505 Is extensive use of plastic goods safe for the environment and health?
- 0506 What is the effect of chemical fertilizers, large irrigation projects and water management on natural habitats?
- 0507 Is radiation produced by nuclear reactors, satellites towers and digital technology good for environment and people's health?
- 0508 How do the 24x7 hour radiations produced by TVs, Smartphones, Social Media, Twitters, Googles, etc. affect people's health? Does long hours of work on computer affect health? Is digital technology created virtual world causing psychological disorders and mental illness?
- 0509 Are online education and webinars good for health, education and research? Does it not destroy all creative potentialities of learning in children and students?
- 0510 How has use of chemical fertilizer affected health of soil, foodgrains, vegetables and fruits, etc.? Can we say that food that all humans eat is healthy and safe? If yes, how? If no, why?
- 0511 How to manage air and water resources that are fundamental for existence?
- 0512 How to improve healthcare methods?
- 0513 How do high rise buildings affect environment, energy and health of the people?
- 0514 Are the highways and high speed vehicles safe? How do large scale buses, trucks, cars, trains, etc. affect environment, energy and people's health?
- 0515 What about Greenhouse Gas and its ill-effects? What is Green Energy? Is it available? Is it necessary for good health? Is it possible to produce ‘Green Energy’ and free the world from Greenhouse Gas without abolishing the present system of production-distribution-and-consumption?
- 0516 What is the state of Public Health System in India, United States, Great Britain, France, Germany, Russia, China, Cuba and other countries? Is the public health system conducive to the good health of all irrespective of their class-caste-creed-gender?
- 0517 How is Private Health System in India and abroad? Is it conducive to the health of all irrespective of their economic status? What is the experience of Private Health System during Corona pandemic?
- 0518 How to formulate and regulate the pharmaceutical industry and research in order to optimize maximum benefits for the human healthcare?

- 0519 Who promotes spurious drugs in India and Third World Countries and why?
- 0520 What is the relationship between drug industries and doctors, between drug industries and politics? How do such relations affect people's health?
- 0521 What is the State of Medical and Health Science Education and Research in India and other countries? How have privatisation of Medical Education and policy of reservation affected quality of medical and health science education and research?
- 0522 What is the state of all other alternative practicing medicines?
- 0523 What is the way out? Is it possible to create a new democratic social system in which all are healthy and happy? If yes, how? If no, why?
- 0524 Is the global economic paradigm of 'economic growth' at the root of climate change, environment degradation, energy pollution and animal health, human industries, civilisation under survival threat because of economic growth paradigm.
- 0525 Does Science need paradigm shift? If yes, what would be its parameters? Should it be freed from market and politics? If yes, how?

Each Research Committee appraises and attempts to integrate current research and theory through deliberations on research papers, Seminar/Symposia/Colloquia/Workshops/Special lectures/ ad-hoc group discussions on themes of greater theoretical and methodological significance. Major objectives of each Research Committee are: (a) to appraise the quality of research and problems associated with it, (b) discover newer theory and method, (c) contribute to improvement of education and research and (d) to bring out publication of papers in all Indian languages in order to fill-in the existing void and thereby create necessary conditions for flowering of science in India that is liberating.

All papers are edited by the respective research committees/thematic panels. Provisional acceptance is issued on receipt of abstract of the paper and final acceptance after submission of the full paper and completion of registration. **One should register only on receipt of provisional acceptance letter.**

All requests for travel support will be considered by the appropriate committee and decision will be communicated by February 15, 2022.

No one without paper and without prior commitment by the General Secretary in writing shall be entitled for travel support and on the spot payment of the TA bill is subject to receipt of UGC' Grant before February 28, 2022 by B. S. Abdur Rahman Crescent Institute of Science and Technology, Vandalur, Chennai. In the event of UGC's refusal to give its grant of Rs. 20,000,00/- B. S. Abdur Rahman Crescent Institute of Science and Technology shall disburse upto Rs.12,00,000/- for travelling expenses including registration of all the resource persons as per commitment to the plenary/public lecture/speakers/chairpersons and convenor/resource persons.

0100 PREAMBLE

The Indian Social Science Academy and B.S. Abdur Rahman Crescent Institute of Science and Technology have resolved to focus the deliberations of the 45th Indian Social Science Congress on 'Environment, Energy, and Health' to enable people of India in particular, and the people of the world in general, to enjoy healthy-happy-creative life while preserving the symbiotic relationship among environment, energy, and life on Planet Earth. The environment of the planet earth and the life on the planet are symbiotically related (all the five forms). We are being warned that any damage to the environment will have disastrous consequences to all life forms, including the human species. Some of the effects are irreversible, both to the human species and planet earth's environment. We have seen the effects of the Corona pandemic.

0200 CONTEXT

Corona pandemic since 2020 world over has threatened the very survival of all humans on Planet Earth today. Significantly, large number of people of all age groups in many countries have lost lives. Public Health Systems in India and many other countries have been stressed, and the Private Health System has proved futile and incapable of meeting the challenges. Quite a large number of medical doctors and health workers too have died. To date, scientists researching in Health Sciences and related subjects have not found proper scientific understanding and solution. Corona pandemic continues unabated, and devastating. It has changed the lifestyle of people and also human values. The spread of deadly contagious viruses among human population and its relation to the degradation of habitats and anthropological encroachment into the environment seems to be highly connected and needs to be addressed urgently.

Corona pandemic has led to severe social pressures and at the same time provided opportunities to cope up with this extreme scenario. Societies have to rise above the average and should adopt innovative methods to overcome the losses incurred by the pandemic.

0300 QUESTIONS

Scientists and social activists from all over the world have been drawing attention toward the breakdown of symbiotic relationship between environment, energy, ecology, climate, and the existence of life, including humans, repeatedly. The call for stopping deforestation, controlling mining, polluting air, water, soil and preserving bio-diversity has been ever-growing since the realization about climate degradation. The threat to the existence of all forms of life on Planet Earth from growing global warming and climate change is becoming deeper and deeper day by day. World scientists' warning that 'Business as usual cannot go on' should be seriously considered and alternative ways should be explored. Biological laboratories, particularly virological laboratories and nuclear research institutions, need to be better monitored and augmented for the betterment of human life on earth. There is an urgent need to redefine our means of cohabitation with other species and nature itself. In this backdrop following questions may be pertinent to be addressed:

- 0301 Is the environment and energy in India and elsewhere clean, unpolluted and congenial to existence of all forms of life including humans on Planet Earth? If not, why?
- 0302 Is the symbiotic relationship between environment, energy and ecology congenial and sustainable? If not, why? Is Energy clean? If yes, why do people talk about 'clean energy' or 'Green Energy'?
- 0303 What is the state of bio-diversity and natural resources in India and other countries. How has accelerated process of deforestation, desertification and mining affected biodiversity, environment and ecology?

- 0304 What is the quantum of pollution of water, forest, air, health, in terms of continuous consumption and unsustainable growth?
- 0305 Is extensive use of plastic goods safe for the environment and health?
- 0306 What is the effect of chemical fertilizers, large irrigation projects and water management on natural habitats?
- 0307 Is radiation produced by nuclear reactors, satellites towers and digital technology good for environment and people's health?
- 0308 How do the 24x7 hour radiations produced by TVs, Smartphones, Social Media, Twitters, Googles, etc. affect people's health? Does long hours of work on computer affect health? Is digital technology created virtual world causing psychological disorders and mental illness?
- 0309 Are on line education and webinars good for health, education and research? Does it not destroy all creative potentialities of learning in children and students?
- 0310 How has use of chemical fertilizer affected health of soil, foodgrains, vegetables and fruits, etc.? Can we say that food that all humans eat is healthy and safe? If yes, how? If no, why?
- 0311 How to manage air and water resources that are fundamental for existence?
- 0312 How to improve healthcare methods?
- 0313 How do high rise buildings affect environment, energy and health of the people?
- 0314 Are the highways and high speed vehicles safe? How do large scale buses, trucks, cars, trains, etc. affect environment, energy and people's health?
- 0315 What about Greenhouse Gas and its ill-effects? What is Green Energy? Is it available? Is it necessary for good health? Is it possible to produce 'Green Energy' and free the world from Greenhouse Gas without abolishing the present system of production-distribution-consumption?
- 0316 What is the state of Public Health System in India, United States, Great Britain, France, Germany, Russia, China, Cuba and other countries? Is the public health system conducive to the good health of all irrespective of their class-caste-creed-gender?
- 0317 How is Private Health System in India and abroad? Is it conducive to the health of all irrespective of their economic status? What is the experience of Private Health System during Corona pandemic?
- 0318 How to formulate and regulate the pharmaceutical industry and research in order to optimize maximum benefits for the human healthcare?
- 0319 Who promotes spurious drugs in India and Third World Countries and why?
- 0320 What is the relationship between drug industries and doctors, between drug industries and politics? How do such relations affect people's health?
- 0321 What is the State of Medical and Health Science Education and Research in India and other countries? How have privatisation of Medical Education and policy of reservation affected quality of medical and health science education and research?
- 0322 What is the state of all other alternative practicing medicines?
- 0323 What is the way out? Is it possible to create a new democratic social system in which all are healthy and happy? If yes, how? If no, why?
- 0324 Is the global economic paradigm of 'economic growth' at the root of climate change, environment degradation, energy pollution and animal health, human industries, civilisation under survival threat because of economic growth paradigm.
- 0325 Does Science need paradigm shift? If yes, what would be its parameters? Should it be freed from market and politics? If yes, how?

0400 CONCEPT

Today Science of Environment, Energy, Ecology, and Health is well developed. All that constitutes environment, organisms, biological and physical interrelationships between and among all the constituents of the Environment is ecology. Air, water, forest, hills, mines, all forms of life, including humans, are integral to the environment, and the nature of interrelationship is vital to the birth, growth, and survival. The harmony between the inorganic and organic world appears to be severely disturbed. All the species and human activities tend to produce powerful positive and negative effects on the environment, which in turn tend to affect the health and wellbeing of humans and other forms of life. Breakdown of food chains in habitats of living species leads to their extinction. It is, therefore, necessary to examine the interrelationships between and among environment, ecology, and health.

The concept of health includes the well-being of both physical and mental states. Health is defined as freedom (absence of) from physical and mental disease. Freedom from physical disease depends upon nutrient food, clean air, water, hygienic living conditions and easy access to the healthcare system, whereas mental health depends upon pleasant and peaceful family, community, and social relationships.

Pulicat Lake

It is a sea shore town 60 kms from Chennai in Tiruvallur District also called as Pazhaverkadu. Watching Flamingos and Beach Activities are the important attractions of this area. The best season is between October – March for over 20,000 migratory birds visiting pulicat for breeding.

Mamallapuram

Long Bas-relief remains of the Pallava Dynasty of the 7th and 8th centuries are the exotic attraction of this town. Apart from these reliefs, Beach, Shore Temple, Five Rathas and Sculpture Work Shops are also a part of this town and attracts millions of Local and International tourists every year. Tourists are charged one –time entry fee for all the monuments. Multi-optional Transport System is available to visit this town that is 60 kms from Chennai City.

Vedanthangal

Vedanthangal Lake is at an altitude of 122 m. This **Bird Sanctuary** established in 1858 in an area of 70 acres, is 85 kms from Chennai. The peak season period between November – March attracts thousands of birds like: Darter, Grebes, Egrets, White Ibis, Garganey Teals, Grey Pelican, Grey Heron, Siberian Painted Storks, Spoonbill and Spot Bill Duck from different parts of the globe visit and breed here.

Gudiyam Caves [85 kms]

It is 10 kms from the Poondi Dam. Robert Bruce Foote, a British geologist, discovered a stone hand axe of Stone Age man in 1863– it opened up research about the 1,00,000 years Paleolithic Age antiquity of this region.

Kapaleeswarar Temple

One of the sacred shrines in Chennai with a lovely and majestic tower exhibits the Dravidian style of architecture. There is a big tank [water body] on its Western Side. The temple and the tank is surrounded by Broad streets on the four sides. The picturesque temple is amidst the crowded residential area. The legend says, Goddess Parvati worshipped Siva in the form of peacock, (means Mayil in Tamil) hence this name Mylapore. Kapaleeswarar and Karpagambal are the main deities. Replicas of 63 revered Saivaite Saints called Nayanmars are located here. Arubathumuvar Vizha [63 saints], Car Festival, Tirukalyanam and the Theppam [Float] Festival are the important festivals of the temple. It attracts lakhs of visitors during these days.

Valluvar Kottam

Popular Modern Land Mark site of Chennai City, shaped like a Temple Charriot. This was built in 1976 in honour of the Great Tamil Poet Tiruvalluvar. He had created the most popular couplets TIRUKKUARAL. 33 ft tall Statue of Tiruvalluvar has been installed for public view. 133 chapters in bas relief, and the 1330 couplets on the granite pillars are special feature of this Kottam. It has a largest auditorium with a 4000 seating capacity used for both Government and Private meetings, gathering and exhibitions.

Choki-Dhani

A Typical Rajasthani Village environment in 15 acre landscape just 27 kms from Chennai City en route to Kanchipuram. A Live Display of Life, Culture, Art, Artisans, and Food of the Land and People of a typical Rajasthani Village stumps the visitors awestruck. Village Tour starts with Traditional Tilak Welcome, visit to the Mandir, Village bazaar, Folk dances; Camel & Horse rides for children, Bioscope, Jyotish, Mehendi and it completes with Unlimited Pure Vegetarian Thali food of mouthwatering delicacies. Guindy National Park

The 2.70 km² Guindy National Park, is unique in more ways than one. It has the rarest vegetation type – the tropical dry evergreen vegetation adjacent to Rajbhavan. The only one of its kind in the world, located in a Metropolis. It contains more than 30 species of trees and number of century old gigantic Banyan Trees. Guindy National Park has a population of 400 black bucks, 2000 spotted deer, 24 jackals, varieties of snakes, over 100 species of birds and over 60 species of butterflies that attracts thousands of visitors to this park irrespective of age group.

Crocodile Bank [44 kms]

Rom and Zai Whitaker established the Madras Crocodile Bank Trust in 1976 with a specific goal of breeding the crocodile population of the Mugger (*Crocodylus palustris*), the Saltwater crocodile (*Crocodylus porosus*) and the rarest Gharials (*Gavialis gangeticus*). The Trust included Turtles, Lizards and Snakes and extended the trust as the Madras Crocodile Bank Trust and Center for Herpetology in 2003.

Kovalam

A seaside village, 40 kms from Chennai City is on the way to Mamallapuram. There is a Popular Church and a Dargah within this village that attracts pilgrims from its neighbouring areas and Chennai too.

Pondicherry

Pondicherry is a notable holiday destination that can be reached with a three-hour drive from Chennai. French Influence is visible in this capital city of Puducherry union territory and hence it is referred to as The French Riviera of the East. It had been under the rule of the French till 1954 and there are still some people who speak French here. Pondicherry is a treasure trove of majestic beaches, ancient temples and historic sites. Sri Aurobindo Ashram is a significant ashram in India and the key attraction of the city.

Auroville is an experimental township built under the guidance of Mirra Alfassa the collaborator and follower of Sri Aurobindo and a key highlight of the city. Pondicherry is recognised for the existence of the Sri Aurobindo and Mother's Ashram which are characterised by the colour grey, in the French quarters. Pondy serves as a great holiday for budget travellers because there is so much to see, and almost everything is just a hop skip and a jump away from each other.

Fort St. George

It is a prestigious landmark of the city. British bought this piece of land from the King of Vijayanagar on 22nd August 1639 and built Fort St. George and named the area as Madraspattinam. St. Mary's Church built in 1860 is located inside the fort complex. Today, Fort St. George houses the State Legislature and the Secretariat, the administrative complex of the Government of Tamil Nadu. The Chief Minister and the Ministers operate from here.

St. George Museum

This museum was opened to the public on 31st January 1948 and is being maintained by the Archaeological Survey of India. Arms like Swords, Daggers, Rifles, Pistols, Mortars, Canon; uniforms of various ranks of the British Army; Church Silverware from the St. Mary's Church, and Tranquebar Zion Church and other antiquities are displayed in Ten Galleries spread over three floors.

Visiting Hours: 9.00 am to 5.00 pm -Closed on Fridays - Entrance Fee: Indians Rs.5/- and Foreigners Rs.100/- or US\$20.

The Marina Beach

It is the pride of Chennai and the Second Longest Beach of its kind in the world. The Memorials of former Chief Ministers C. N. Annadurai and M. G. Ramachandran are located here. The stretch opposite to the beach is occupied by Madras University, Government Departments, Senate House, Presidency college, Cricket Stadium and Swami Vivekananda Memorial House and All India Radio.

Santhome Cathedral Basilica

It is one of the Basilica built over the tomb of an Apostle in the world. It is believed that the remains of **St. Thomas** were interned / Buried in this beach in 78 A.D., on which a Church was built. Several years later it was shifted to the present location further towards the land. It houses the mortal remains of St. Thomas. Since then, this is popularly called as Santhome Church. Pope John Paul II visited and prayed at this tomb on 5th February 1986.

Memorials of Mahatma Gandhi, Rajaji, Kamarajar and Bakthavatsalam : These memorials in honour of the Freedom Fighters are located on a stretch of land near Raj Bhavan, the Residence of the Governor of Tamil Nadu. Each of the leaders honoured are different from each other in terms of approach and activity, but with a common goal – OUR NATION.

Vivekananda House and Museum

Tudor Ice Company was built in 1842 to store ice blocks. From then it is being called as Ice House even after the company's closure. Bilagiri Iyengar, a noted Lawyer bought it in 1885 and named it "*Castle Kernan*" in honour of his Justice friend. Vivekananda stayed at the Ice House between 6 February 1897 to 14 February 1897. Every year this event is celebrated as Vivekananda Navarathiri. The pujas and festivals performed by the Ramakrishna Mutt were shifted to New Mutt premises in Mylapore. But the premises continued to be the Memorial of Swami Vivekananda. Later the Government took over the building in 1930. In 1963, on his birth centenary it was renamed as Vivekanandar House. In 1999, on Centenary of Swamiji's return to India from the United States, the house was renovated and opened a fresh by the then Chief Minister. Life history Photographs, books about him / by him are kept on display"

Kolavai Lake

It is 60 kms from Chennai. This lake is located in the Kanchipuram District. Chenglepattu Town is on the southern end of this big Kolavai Lake.

Island Ground

This is an artificial river island around the Coovum River created in the 19th Century, by connecting the Coovum River with the then Elambore River. It is a huge stretch of land suitable for big exhibitions of different Themes and Purpose. It is located opposite to the War Memorial. Tamil Nadu Tourism Department conducts a three month long Tourism and Trade Fair between January [Pongal holiday] and March.

Theosophical Society

This society was founded in the USA by Madame Blavatsky and Colonel Olcott. It was later shifted to Adayar –Chennai in the year 1882 and it is at present, the International Headquarters of this society . This society encourages the study of comparative religions, philosophy and science and rational thought. 450 years old Adyar Banyan Tree or the Adayar Bodhi Tree, with branches of the tree in an area of 40,000 sq ft, located inside the Society's campus. It is believed to be largest of its kind in the world.

Elliot's Beach

It is the stretch of beach along the coast on the south of the popular Marina beach. This area has the three popular religious establishments called Velankanni Church [Similar to the church in Nagapattinam], AshtaLakshmi Temple [8 different incarnations of Goddess Lakshmi] and Holistic Granite replica of ArupadaiVeedu [6 special Abodes of Lord Murugan].

Kalakshetra Foundation

This was founded by Rukmini Devi Arundale in 1936. In her own words , it was started "with the sole purpose of resuscitating in modern India, recognition of the priceless artistic traditions of our country and of imparting to the young the true spirit of Art, devoid of vulgarity and commercialism."This centre has produced notable Bharatha Natyam Dancers [classical Dance performers]. Birla Planetarium

This planetarium was inaugurated on May 11, 1988 and it is popularly called as modern indoor Universe. Multi-Dimensional activities and projection arrangements and a Sky theatre with a seating capacity of 236 persons at a time are the special features of this Planetarium. Adjoining this is the Periyar Science and Technology Museum open to public from 10.00 am to 5.00 pm. This attracts Students as well as Scientists too.

St.Thomas Mount

It was called as ParangiMalai earlier. An old Portuguese Church built around 1514 is located on this tiny hillock. St.Thomas is believed to have been martyred here and the cross in the church is an Old Stone Cross clutched by the apostle St. Thomas in his hand while dying. The Blood stain mark on the cross found even now makes it to be called Bleeding Cross too. The mortal remains of St. Thomas was transferred to Santhome Shore. Oil painting of Madona believed to be painted by St.Luke, brought to India by St.Thomas, is placed atop the Altar in this church.

Ripon Building

It was built in the year 1913. The white building and 132 ft tall clock tower is the solid attraction of this structure. It is the Administrative Complex and Council assembly House of the Chennai City Corporation. The building was named by the British in honour of Lord Ripon who was the Governor General and father of Self-Government in India.

Government Museum

The plan for this museum was initiated by the Madras Literary Society in 1846 AD and it was established on January 01, 1951, with Dr. Edward Balfour as the First Officer in charge. This is the second oldest museum, next to Kolkatta. This is a multi-purpose State Government Museum located in Egmore, spread in an area of 16.25 acres of land. Six independent buildings have 46 galleries. It is rich in archaeological, numismatic, and largest Roman collections too. Buddhist Ruins from Amaravathi find a prominent place here. The Museum celebrated its Centenary in 1951 AD inaugurated by Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, the then Prime Minister of India.

Connemara Library

The Connemara library, a treasure house of books, periodicals, and newspapers was opened to public in 1861. This library was named after the then Governor of Madras, Lord Connemara. It has a collection of over 6,00,000 books, a holistic reference enclosure, IAS study centre, and a Braille library today. Contact: 28193751 for details. [Monday - Saturday 9.00 am to 7.00 pm]

Arignar Anna Zoological Park

The Work to establish the Zoological Park was started in 1976. It was opened to the public in 1985. It is one of the largest zoological complexes in South East Asia sprawling over an area of 602 ha. This houses 40 varieties of Mammals, 20 Avian species, and 14 species of Reptiles. Animal welfare, Research, Veterinary, Horticulture, and Sanitation teams, apart from maintaining the Zoological Complex, conducts awareness campaigns to the School Children and Teachers as a part of its Education program Butterfly Park.

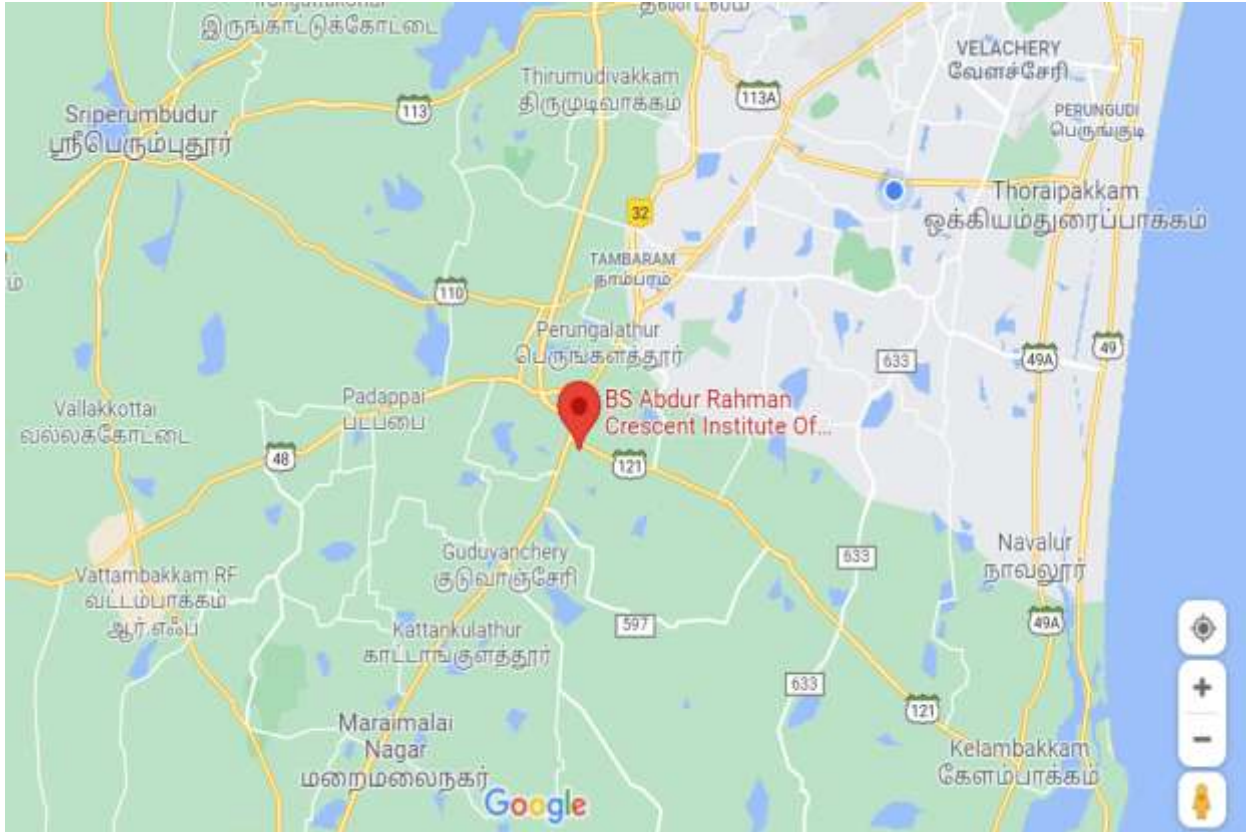

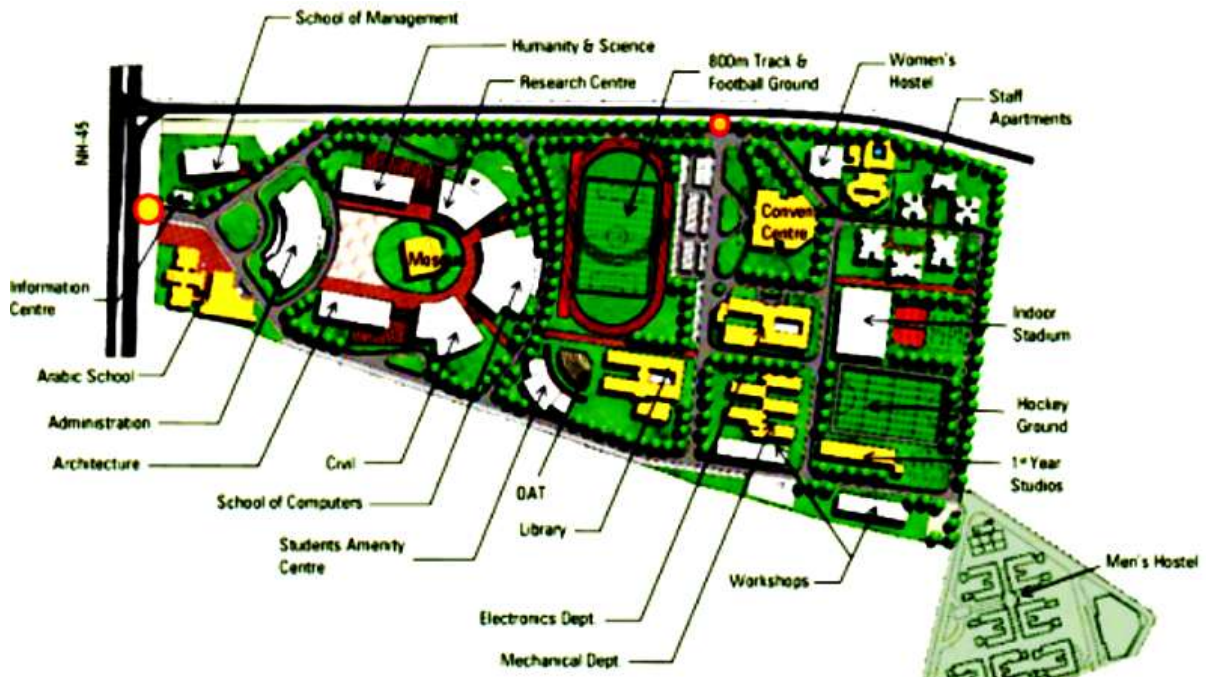

The Indian Social Science Academy (ISSA when abbreviated) is the first National Science Academy of independent Democratic Republic of India and fourth in chronicle order. The other three National Science Academies—Indian National Science Academy (INSA), Indian Academy of Sciences (IAS) and National Science Academy of India (NSAI) were born in British India. ISSA was born, 47 years ago, on August 15, 1974 at University of Allahabad in an assembly of young scientists. August 15, 1974 symbolizes a beginning of an altogether new science reflecting democratic needs, aspirations, creative urges / potentialities, history, culture and traditions of peoples of India. Its name was carefully chosen for reflecting the true meaning and function of science. The setting up of the Indian Social Science Academy also heralded a beginning of a new movement for unity of science of Nature-Humans-Society by forging unity among all branches of science. Many described it as a *barometer* of science and society in India, in particular and world in general. In more than one sense ISSA is a unique body in the whole world. Toady the Indian Social Science Academy is unique among all Science Academy in the world as brings all subjects of science under one umbrella.

Science means objective knowledge of non-living and living things / objects and knowledge means answer to questions 'what', 'how' and 'why', about a thing / object. The word 'Nature' connotes all forms of objects / things / matter including humans and societies. Nature-Humans-Society form one single continuum. So division of science into physics, chemistry, biology, environment, ecology, agriculture, medical, social, historical etc., is artificial and all such divisions provide partial objective knowledge of Nature-Humans-Society. Unity of Science of Nature-Humans-Society, therefore, is necessary for having correct and full understanding of Nature-Human-Society science. Thus, viewed science is unitary as well as uniting.

The Science as an objective knowledge of non-living and living objects / things / matter is produced through collective mental and physical labour of men and women. What is the result of collective labour is termed as **social** and what is **social is public and not private**. Science, therefore, is **social**. It springs in society comprising men and women. **Because it is social it has social functions**. It has the prime role in enabling men and women to enjoy higher quality of material, social and cultural life in harmony with Nature. However, all such social functions of science filter through different groups in the society because of which one doesn't find one-to-one relationship between science and conditions of all men and women of all societies. Humans' inability to create a science-based society is well reflected in modern societies all over the world.

The Indian Social Science Academy seeks to discover, develop and disseminate science of Nature-Humans-Society in Indian conditions in particular, and world conditions in general, with a mission to build a new Democratic Republic of India where there is no hunger, no poverty, no unemployment, no illiteracy, no disease, no bigotry, no superstitions, no communalism, no casteism and no discrimination of any form and where all men, women and children enjoy equally good quality of material, social, cultural and spiritual life in harmony with Nature without any kind of fear of violence, rape and murder. Its mission in _____ creating an altogether new world which is free from hunger, poverty, diseased, hatred and war.

'Love to All, Prejudice None' is the Philosophy of Science which guides all scientific pursuits of ISSA.

Founders of the Indian Social Science Academy thought that science can benefit the peoples of a given society **only** when it is taught and researched in their **own language**. **Communication of scientific research and science education in people's own language, therefore, is key to the unfolding of creative potentialities of peoples and benefiting them**. Unfortunately, even after 75 years of independence science in India is communicated through English. The end result is peoples of India who fund all scientific research are deprived of its benefits. The creativity in science is continuously declining. The Indian Social Science Academy., therefore, seeks to change it by creating necessary conditions for communication of scientific research and science education in Indian languages involving publication of research journals, monographs, books, etc., in all Indian languages.

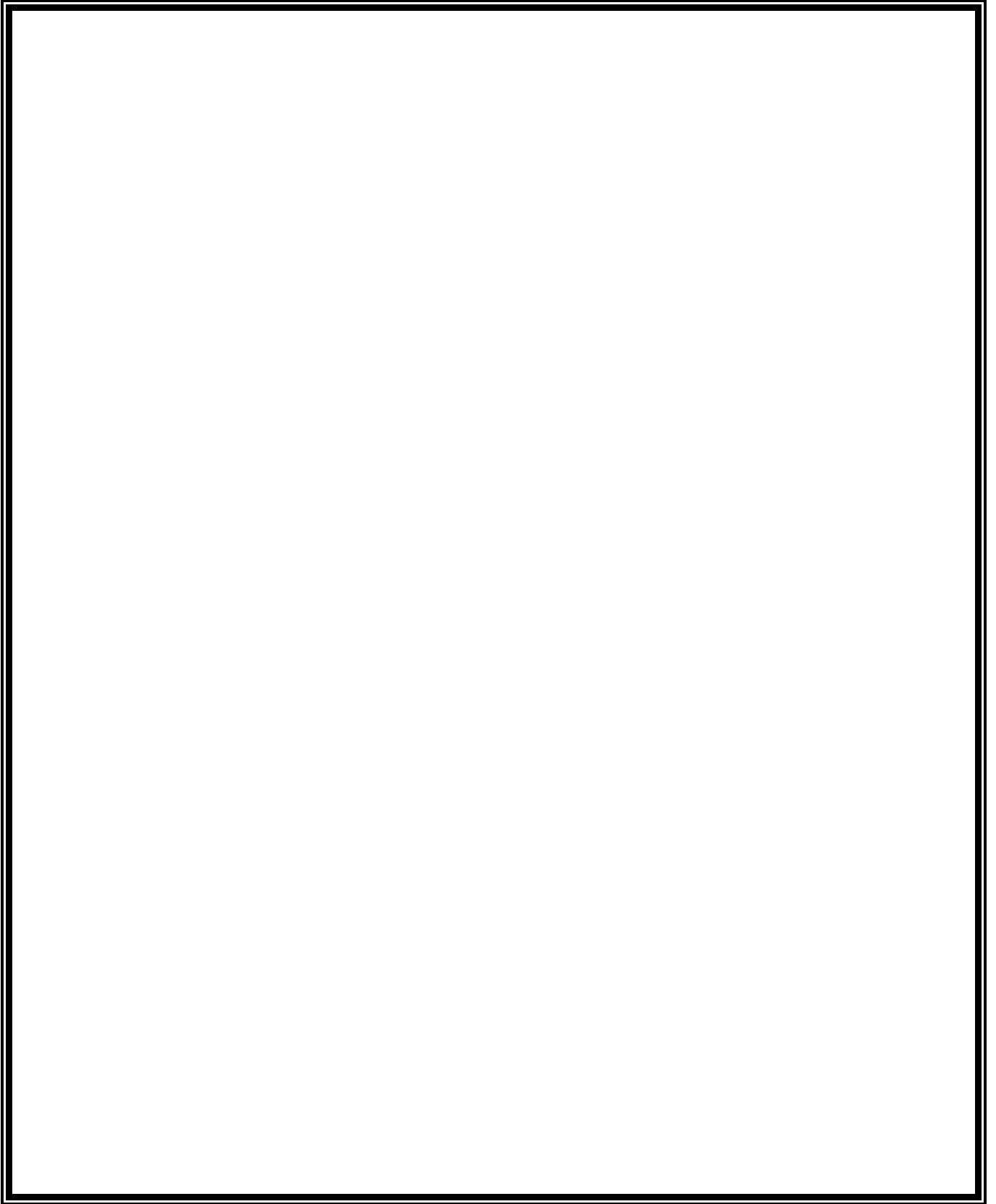

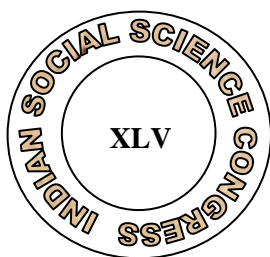
